On the Road to Gettysburg... with James Rapson, Treasurer & Reunion Host

As you read this, we are seven short months out from the 15th Bi-Annual Reunion in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania on September 24th to 27th, 2015. The many details of planning have been mostly completed and the organized activities are listed on your reservation form on page 7.

Please remember that the Eisenhower Hotel has requested that ALL room reservations be made directly with them and to please use our Group Code of 300670 when making your reservations.

We have been given a rate of \$95.00 per night for a Double plus appropriate taxes and fees. These rates will also apply for three days prior to and after the Reunion for those who wish to make an extended stay in the Gettysburg area.

One of the reasons that Gettysburg was selected was that it was within four (4) hours driving time for nearly 65% of our Shipmates. Following this rationale, it was felt that many Shipmates would prefer to break into smaller groups for exploring , sight-seeing, etc. Our aim is not to over

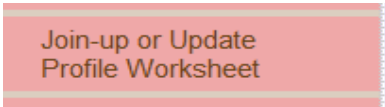

The Treasurer's Report

For some reason or another the time frame for new articles for the newsletter seems to come more quickly than I often realize. With that, 2014 was good for the Association with a regular stream of dues monies flowing in and a reasonable amount of sales through the Ship's Store.

We were in a good financial position at year end with all of our obligations paid, no outstanding receipts due and a healthy balance in our checking account. The Association continues to operate on a cash basis without the need of a credit card to make our work either easier or more difficult.

The reporting of our financial position continues each month with the Officers, Board Members and those Shipmates who have requested a copy of the financial report - receiving them within several days of the close of the month. The financial data was delivered to our outside accountant in January for his financial report and the filing of the appropriate tax return.

As I have said previously, if the financial information is not gathered properly, and if it is not reported in a timely manner, then that is the start of the downfall of the Association. My pledge to the Association and to my Shipmates is that it will never happen on my watch and that a full accounting of all of our activities will always be available.

Now that I have covered that portion of the financial picture, please continue to send in your dues monies and, if you are able, a contribution to help those who may be unable. there are lots of interesting things to see and do. I also stayed at the Eisenhower hotel - which is a good choice for getting from place to place.

One more comment about the security of your information: We keep all your records private. No one gets their hands on any of your personal information. But, in a broader sense, you probably have passwords for various web sites you visit.

My experience is that many people use the simplest of passwords that can be easily "hacked" (broken). The most common passwords used today are still: "password" and "123456".

Your passwords should not be your

name or any family/pet name. The best passwords contain letters in both UPPER and lower case, at least 8 characters long, include numbers, and special characters such as the pound sign #, or ampersand &. In addition, you should change your passwords every month or two. Make a listing if you need to and keep it at home in a safe place - *not on a sticky note on your PC or your refrigerator!*

Finally, although it's a lot of work, you should have a separate password for each site that requires one. *Why? If a hacker gets his hands on one of your passwords, he will have access to all your password protected sites!*

On Christmas Eve in 1959, the Fiske was anchored at Cannes, France, a few hundred yards off the beach; we could see the lights from the hotels and cars driving along the boulevard that hugged the shore.

We were port and starboard liberty; I had the watch, such as it was in port for a sonarman.

Doug Gunderson, another sonarman, had the quarterdeck watch.

About 20:00 hours he came down to the compartment and told me that it seemed to him the lights on land were getting closer. I went topside to look. It was a windy night and it did seem that we were a bit nearer to the beach than we had been a few hours ago. Perhaps we were swinging our anchor? The captain and most of the officers were ashore and the OOD, it seemed, was not concerned.

An hour later, Doug came down again and said we were really close to

the shore now. A scraping noise came from the hull; I felt the ship bump and list a few degrees. I ran back topside, and sure enough, we had dragged our



anchor and drifted onto the beach. I could almost throw a stone to the road - it was that close!

There we stayed for a day or more as the damage was assessed. Luckily, only one of the screws had been damaged. We limped to Malta and went into dry dock for several days while the damaged screw was replaced.

Valletta was a nice liberty port, and the crew enjoyed the unexpected respite, along with the embarrassing knowledge that we were probably the only ship in the US Navy to run aground on the French Riviera!

As a followup to ST1 Ron White's Fiske Tale about our 1967 "Med Cruise" last November, I was on watch as we



were waiting to transit when things got "exciting". A representative from the US Embassy came aboard and needed to get a message sent to the POTUS and everyone else in command at the Pentagon that something was about to HAPPEN SOON!

I was unable to get up a phone link so tried finding "CW" link. Afterwards, I wished I had called for help from Mallory (he was much better with the key), but I finally got up with a Navy Com Center in Turkey.

I remember that the ComSta operator challenged me as to the DTG (date time group) as it took some minutes to do this, and I'd already "stamped the DTG" when creating the initial message (but didn't change it when I finally found someone to take it). Lucky for me I had the correct secure info in front of me to respond to his challenge, and finally got the message sent. *In other words.....the 6-7 day war was starting!*

We then started transit of the Suez and a "lovely" 2-3 months in the Red Sea. We had beard growing contests, fishing contests and any other contest we could think of. *And oh, by the way - we also had water rations - phew!*

All this time we were under radar from both sides. It was kind of tense!

Ship's Log Entries...

Historian's Report

A majestic ship was she, that sailed the seven seas, we were her crew, we saw it through, and logged our history.



Thanks to a letter I received from Shipmate Eugene Peloquin recently, I learned that the USS Decatur (DD 936) was the flagship of DesRon 8 in the late 1950's and into the mid-'60's. Then Ensign Peloquin reported on board the Fiske in 1957 and transferred to the staff of DesRon 8 aboard Decatur in 1959.

After I learned of Decatur's role in DesRon 8 I did a little 'google' search (the historian's best friend, if one is careful), and learned that she was not a 'Lucky Ship' like the Fiske.

She was commissioned on December 7th 1956, not to my mind a great choice of dates. In August 1959, while in Naples, Italy, on her first Med Cruise with DesRon 8, Decatur had an Engine Room fire that took 2 hours to get under control.

Fortunately, her magazines had been flooded as a precaution during that event. Things went a little better when in 1961 when she acted as a spacecraft recovery vessel for some of the early Mercury astronauts; however, on May 6th 1964, she collided with the USS Lake Champlain (CVS 39) after losing steering control. That resulted in the destruction of her entire bridge and

foremast. Amazingly, there was no loss of life or personnel injury.

This ended her place in DesRon 8, upon which Decatur was placed 'in commission in reserve' and extensively converted over the next 2 years. Following that, she was re-commissioned DDG 31 in April 1967. The remainder of her service was in the Pacific Fleet. - Gil

Shipmates, Gil has nearly completed his compilation of Fiske History, but lacks photos of all who contributed. His goal is to have this project completed by the end of June.
