

Unfortunately, four of our shipmates will not be there. You may have known some of them:

John Charles Gabriesheski, a Gunner's mate who was aboard from 1960 to 1963, who died December 21, 2017. Then, Victor McHardy, Boatswain Mate Master Chief ,who sailed on 842 from 1977 to 1980, passed on October 22, 2018, and Max Lindsey, ET3, who kept the ship's systems in shape from 1957 to 1959 died on April 28, 2018. I want to make a special mention of John R. Frazer who sailed on the Fiske from 1960 to 1965.

He was an ET2 then and made a career in the Navy, eventually becoming a master chief.

John was active in the Fiske organization and proudly wore his uniform to the reunions, the gold hash marks - from his wrist to his shoulder - testament that he was a very special sailor.

For those of you who have attended past reunions, you may recall that John was our "official photographer" for many years, He passed last month on January 12, 2019.

In keeping with traditions and mourning their passings, I have added them to the Honor Roll; during the reunion ceremonies in Saratoga Springs, we will toll the Ship's bell in memory of them, never to be forgotten. - Jeff



History is unually written in great broad strokes with most of the small details hinted at, but seldom explored. Our book looks at history from a highly personal view - and it is important.


I've said it a hundred times, if you don't write it down, it never happened.

Constitutionally Speaking

Secretary Kovite Continues His Special Report...

Articles I, II and III describe the Congress, Executive Branch and the Judiciary, respectively, all of which have been covered in previous editions of this newsleter. *Article IV deals with the states - their relationships and duties to each other and to the federal government.*

Article IV - Section I - State Acts and Records

Section I states that "Full Faith and Credit be given in each state to the public acts, records and judicial proceedings of every other state." So, a court judgment in one state is valid in any other state. Congress may pass laws regulating these records and proceedings.

Article IV- Section II - Section II deals with individuals.



<u>The first paragraph</u> says that a citizen of one state is entitled to all the privileges of the other states. Therefore, driver's license from one state is valid in the other states.

<u>The second paragraph</u>, called the Extradition Clause, says that when a person is a fugitive from justice in one state that person will be sent back to the state where the crime occurred.

<u>The third paragraph</u>, referred to as the Fugitive Slave Clause, states that escaped slaves must be returned to where they escaped. The Thirteenth Amendment, passed in 1865, nullified this clause.

Article IV - Section III

Section III describes how new states can be admitted by the Congress. For instance, one state cannot be formed inside another state (sounds logical, but remember they never did this before).

Article IV- Section IV - Guarantees to States

Finally, Section IV promises every state a republican form of government (citizens elect representatives to govern them) and protection from invasion and, if requested by the states, domestic violence.

Our Constitution is a model that brings hopes of democracy to other nations of the world. As your shipmate, and a retired teacher, it is my honor to share insights of this amazing document with you These articles will continue in future newsletters as space permits. - Jeff

Do not respond to any questions, especially those that can be answered with "Yes".


Never give out personal information such as account numbers. If you get an inquiry from someone who says they represent a government agency, or company, hang up and call the phone number on your account.

Consumer Tips to Stop Unwanted Robocalls and Avoid Phone Scams

Use caution if pressured for immediate information. If you have a voice mail account with your phone service, be sure to set a password for it.

Talk to your phone company about call blocking tools they may have and check into apps that you can download to your mobile device to block unwanted calls.

Register your number on the *"Do Not Call List"* to block unwanted calls. The Do Not Call Registry accepts registrations from both cell phones and land lines.











Report From the Treasurer

We hope to offer those things that will excite your interest and give you the reasons to travel once again to meet up with "old" friends and make new ones with Shipmates who may be at their first reunion.


On Wednesday afternoon, September 25, 2019 we will be visiting the Saratoga National Historic Park, the site of several deciding battles with the British near the end of the Revolutionary War. It is a walking and/or motor (your vehicle) tour with stops at various historical places for a narrated/guided tour. You are encouraged to look at their web-site for more detailed information to assist you in your decision to participate in this tour.

On Thursday morning, September 26, 2019 we will be visiting the USS Slater DE-766 in Albany, NY. She is one of the surviving WWII Destroyer Escorts and has been exceptionally well maintained by their Association. They provide guided tours aboard the ship that are about 90 minutes long. Keep in mind that while almost all spaces are open and they have made accommodations for visitors, it is a small ship that will give those who have never been aboard an example of how life was to serve on a Destroyer. You are also encouraged to visit their web site for more detailed information.

Now there are several things to consider for these tours. While there is no fee for the Saratoga Battlefields, we are asking for a \$10.00 donation in order to get a proper head count so that we can let them know in advance.

The monies collected will be given to the Saratoga National Historic Park by the Fiske Association. Likewise,







for the USS Slater Tour, their Group Rate for Reunion Groups is \$7.00, but we are going to ask you for a \$10.00 donation in order to also get a proper head count. While members of the Tin Can Sailors (Destroyer Veterans) would be at no charge, we feel that a group donation would be very appropriate and the Fiske Association would forward the funds collected.

The last item to consider is how we get to these two tours. Due to the extremely high costs of buses, we are looking to car pool with the vehicles available from our shipmates. On your Reservation Form will be a place to indicate the number of *additional* passengers you could take if you are going on the tour.

For example: you have four seat sedan and you and your wife are going on the tour then you have two additional seats available. Once we collect that information, we can ensure that all who wish to go on the tours have a place to sit. One thought to keep in mind, if your wife does NOT want to go on the tours but would rather car pool up with other ladies, then your vehicle is "out of service" for the tour because some of the ladies would rather do something else as a group. Think wisely on this subject and let's provide for all of our attendees for whatever and wherever they may want to do and where they may want go at the reunion.

Finally, the Ship's Store Order Form has a place to note your dues payment of \$10.00. It's still the best bargain in town and very important to keeping your Association on a firm financial footing.


