



### Saratoga Weather Report...




Shipmates,

# Constitutionally Speaking.... .....Article Three- The Judiciary Branch

The Supreme Court of the United States (SCOTUS), established in 1789, is the highest court in the nation for all cases involving the Constitution or the laws of the United States, including treaties, controversies between states and issues affecting ambassadors.

Article Three gives Congress the power to create the Supreme Court and any other federal courts. The number of justices has changed over the years in 1801 Congress decided it should be five - then, in 1863 it was ten. The Judiciary Act of 1869 set it at nine, and there it has stayed.

Nowhere does it stipulate how long a term a judge may serve, but Congress has determined that Supreme Court justicies and other federal judges serve for life - or - until they are impeached for "bad behavior". This is to prevent politics from entering into a judicial decision since a justice would not be beholden to any party or person.

All trials for crimes shall be decided by a jury and held in the state where the crime was committed, that is why when a criminal flees to another state, the state where he/she was arrested sends the criminal back to the state where the crime was committed.

The last part of the article deals with treason, which is meant to be "levying war" against the United States or giving "aid and comfort" to our enemies. Two witnesses or a confession are required to convict someone for treason..

#### **The Judicial Oath**

"I, \_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will administer justice without respect to persons, and do equal right to the poor and to the rich, and that I will faithfully and impartially discharge and perform all the duties incumbent upon me as under the Constitution and laws of the United States.

Our Constitution is a model that brings hopes of democracy to other nations of the world. I will continue to share insights of this amazing document with you in future newsletters.



# Celebrating Veteran's Day



Veterans Day originated as "Armistice Day" on Nov. 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of World War I.

Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual observance, and Nov. 11 became a national holiday beginning in 1938.

Unlike Memorial Day, Veterans Day pays tribute to all American veterans—living or dead—but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.

Veterans Day occurs on November 11 every year in the United States.

In 1954, after lobbying efforts by veterans' service organizations, the



83rd U.S. Congress amended the 1938

act that had made Armistice Day a holiday, striking the word "Armistice" in favor of "Veterans."



In 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower officially changed the name of the holiday from Armistice Day to Veterans Day. In 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill was passed by Congress, which moved the celebration of Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October in 1971, but in

1975, President Gerald Ford returned Veterans Day to November 11, due to the important historical significance of the date. From then on, November 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

Great Britain, France, Australia and Canada also commemorate the veterans of World War I and World War II on or near November 11th:

Canada has Remembrance Day, while Britain has Remembrance Sunday on the second Sunday of November).

In Europe, Great Britain and the Commonwealth countries, it is common to observe two minutes of

silence at 11 a.m. every November 11. - *Editor*


