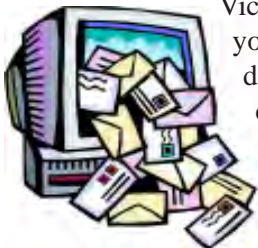

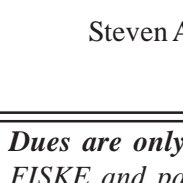

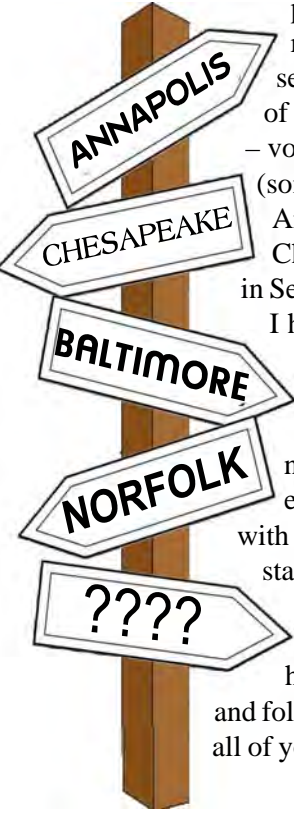

Baltimore-Style Crab Cakes

reprinted from *Food and Wine* - by Andrew Zimmern

Instructions

In a small bowl, whisk the mayonnaise with the egg, mustard, Worcestershire sauce and hot sauce until smooth.

In a medium bowl, lightly toss the crabmeat with the cracker crumbs. Gently fold in the mayonnaise mixture. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour.

Scoop the crab mixture into eight 1/3-cup mounds; lightly pack into 8 patties, about 1 1/2 inches thick. In a large skillet, heat the oil until shimmering. Add the crab cakes and cook over moderately high heat until deeply golden and heated through, about 3 minutes per side. Transfer the crab cakes to plates and serve with lemon wedges.

MAKE AHEAD

The crab cakes can be prepared through Step 2 and refrigerated overnight.



Ingredients

- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1 large egg, beaten
- 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon hot sauce
- 1 pound jumbo lump crab meat, picked over
- 20 saltine crackers, finely crushed
- 1/4 cup canola oil
- Lemon wedges, for serving

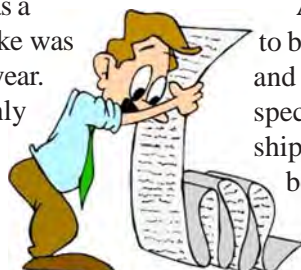
Introducing 2nd VP Pete Brotschul

We cruised mainly on the east coast from Maine to Mayport, Florida, and spent time one

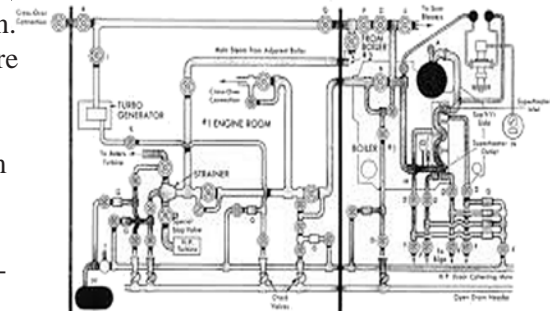


winter in the shipyard in East Boston.

I look forward to serving you in any way I can to ensure our viability in the future, lest we forget the time we had on our ship - the USS FISKE DD/DDR-842.

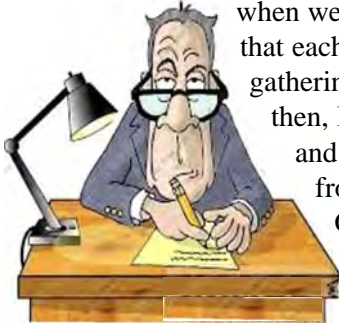

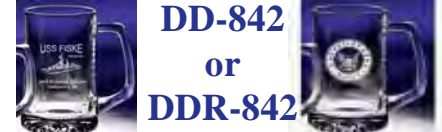
